From **Fire Chief Glenn Johnson**, an after Pilgrimage Report!

On behalf of **Chief Taylor** and myself (Chief Johnson and Deputy Police Chief JP Taylor served as joint incident commanders for Pilgrimage), we'd like to say thanks for all the hard work that went into making **Pilgrimage 2022 a success**. **Monique McCullough** did a great job of bringing festival and city staff together and ensuring we were meeting the needs of our community and festival attendees. **Franklin Emergency Management** made sure we were aware of weather conditions and future forecasts. Our **Streets Department**

were like Ninjas, you didn't see them but you could see the fruits of their labor. **Our traffic patterns and lighting** for Franklin road didn't go unnoticed. The **Parks Department** was always monitoring radio traffic and would jump in and help. We greatly appreciated their involvement in assisting an ADA attendee in getting her scooter to the medical tent so she could accompany her mother, who had a medical emergency, to the hospital. **Risk Management** made sure the footprint was safe and hazards were identified. We had great support from our **City Administration**. We appreciate their willingness to jump in and help where needed. Our **Communications team** kept our community informed through social media and helped keep everyone updated with pertinent information. The **Fire Department** handled a multitude of emergency and non-emergency situations. Our inspectors made sure fire hazards were identified and corrected. Williamson County EMS was key in keeping the medical needs of staff and attendees met. The Williamson County Emergency Management documentation unit created a chronological sequence of events that will help us identify trends and improve our operations plans for future events. **FPD** did a great job with their traffic patterns. **We were able to clear the footprint of** attendees in 21 minutes on Saturday and 17 minutes on Sunday. The Flex team walked over 26 miles patrolling the crowds in plain clothes inside the footprint and the SWAT team was ready with two quick reaction teams both days. All of our operations were monitored by our FD Drone team. Along with our **GIS team**, this section provided us the data and live video feed that was key to the festival's success and giving us information to make strategic decisions. Last but not least, is our Field Comm personnel. We would have not been able to complete our missions without their guidance and delivery of pertinent information. Our success hinges on effective communications. We are fortunate to be a part of this great team and look forward to next year. Thanks!






Planning and HR went bowling today, and had a great time! HR were worthy competitors, but the "**Lane Use Planners**" inched by them for the win. Included in the photo below is:
