My husband and I have been considering properties in Franklin for the past number of years, since our only daughter and her family -- including our only two grandchildren -- live in and love your fine city.

It was in August of 2021 when I first contacted Ms. McCoy, since I was confused about whether or not certain properties in which we were potentially interested were in danger of flooding. That happened to be the time when Ms. McCoy was unable to speak on the phone due to vocal cord problems. Ms. Sauseda immediately and graciously stepped in to hear my questions and concerns by phone, and convey them to Ms. McCoy. Ms. Sauseda then promptly responded back to me with the requested answers and information. Ms. Sauseda certainly went "above and beyond the call of duty" in facilitating that communication, which I greatly appreciated!

Since then, I've had the pleasure and blessing of communicating with Ms. McCoy and Ms. Sauseda from time to time, as additional properties of interest came on the market which were in question regarding the possible danger of flooding.

Ms. McCoy is extremely knowledgeable and helped me understand that the Flood Factor info given on Redfin.com is often at odds with the FEMA Flood Map information. She has been consistently helpful, prompt, and gracious in providing information, plus links for maps for areas in and around Franklin.

The City of Franklin is truly blessed to have Ms. McCoy and Ms. Sauseda representing your city to the public, with knowledge, sincere concern, and speedy and friendly communications.

I'm delighted and grateful to feel that I have two special "Franklin friends" as I look forward to eventually moving to Franklin.

REMINDER: This year's "Give a Day. Serve a Day. Get a Day." campaign for United Way. If you give a total contribution of at least \$100 to United Way (I'd challenge you to consider giving the equivalent of one day's pay), and commit to volunteer at least 8 hours over the next year with your chosen cause (i.e. – non-profit, church, school, etc.), you can receive an EXTRA personal day in 2023. The additional personal day will be awarded on January 1, 2023 and must be used during the 2023 calendar year.

Here are the details:

- Your 2023 pledge to United Way can take the form of a payroll deduction (spread over 26 paychecks in 2023) or as a one-time contribution, whichever works best for you. The minimum pledge to qualify is \$100. You should make your financial pledge using the attached United Way Pledge Form or request a form from Human Resources.
- We ask that you sign a 2023 volunteer pledge that includes your name, department, and the cause/organization(s) that you are committing to dedicate at least 8 hours of volunteer time (nonwork hours) this coming year (attached). The choice of where and how you volunteer is up to you. You may also want to work with other City team members to volunteer as a group. - Once you have made both your United Way pledge and your volunteer pledge you will be credited
 with an additional personal day on January 1, 2023. The personal day must be used during the
 2023 calendar year.

The "Give a Day. Serve a Day. Get a Day." campaign runs through <u>December 5th</u>. Both forms will need to be returned to Human Resources. If you are submitting via e-mail, please send both forms to <u>cara.rives@franklintn.gov</u> **NOTE: Every form that is submitted this year will be responded to via email to let you know it has been received. If you submit a form and do not get an email confirmation, please contact Cara Rives in HR
