You can streamline your donation experience and save up to 15 minutes by visiting RedCrossBlood.org/RapidPass to complete your pre-donation reading and health history questions on the day of your appointment.

REMINDER: This year's "Give a Day. Serve a Day. Get a Day." campaign for United Way. If you give a total contribution of at least \$100 to United Way (I'd challenge you to consider giving the equivalent of one day's pay), and commit to volunteer at least 8 hours over the next year with your chosen cause (i.e. – non-profit, church, school, etc.), you can receive an EXTRA personal day

in 2023. The additional personal day will be awarded on January 1, 2023 and must be used during the 2023 calendar year.

Here are the details:

- Your 2023 pledge to United Way can take the form of a payroll deduction (spread over 26 paychecks in 2023) or as a one-time contribution, whichever works best for you. The minimum pledge to qualify is \$100. You should make your financial pledge using the attached United Way Pledge Form or request a form from Human Resources.
- We ask that you sign a 2023 volunteer pledge that includes your name, department, and the cause/organization(s) that you are committing to dedicate at least 8 hours of volunteer time (nonwork hours) this coming year (attached). The choice of where and how you volunteer is up to you. You may also want to work with other City team members to volunteer as a group. If you are looking for some ideas, United Way has an online volunteer resource: https://www.unitedway.org/get-involved/volunteer
- Once you have made both your United Way pledge and your volunteer pledge you will be credited with an additional personal day on January 1, 2023. The personal day must be used during the 2023 calendar year.

The "Give a Day. Serve a Day. Get a Day." campaign runs through <u>December 5th</u>. Both forms will need to be returned to Human Resources. If you are submitting via e-mail, please send both forms to <u>cara.rives@franklintn.gov</u> **NOTE: Every form that is submitted this year will be responded to via email to let you know it has been received. If you submit a form and do not get an email confirmation, please contact Cara Rives in HR
