Mechanical - Electrical Permit

Effective May 1, 2023

Mechanical Contractors are required to have a separate electrical permit for all HVAC work performed on Residential structures

Permit requirement

• An Electrical license is not required for this permit.

Inspection process

- Mechanical contractors will be responsible for scheduling an individual electrical inspection for equipment connections on residential structures when work is completed.
- Per the 2017 National Electrical Code (NFPA 72), Inspections will be performed for code compliance connections from the point of Electrical contractor D-mark to the HVAC equipment installed.
- When code deficiencies are documented by the City of Franklin Inspector, a correction notice will be placed in the outside equipment disconnect.
- When a correction notice is left on site, it is the responsibility of the Mechanical contractor to correct the work and request a re-inspection of the work performed.
