






- KEEP FIRE PITS AT LEAST 10 FEET AWAY FROM ANYTHING THAT CAN BURN.
 USE A FIRE PIT SCREEN, WHICH HELPS TO CONTAIN SPARKS, EMBERS, AND ASH
 KEEP CHILDREN AND PETS AT LEAST 3 FEET AWAY FROM THE FIRE PIT.





- IF YOU USE REAL CANDLES, REMEMBER TO BLOW THEM OUT BEFORE LEAVIN
 THE ROOM OR GOING TO BEE
 KEEP LIT CANDLE SAT LEAST I FOOT AWAY FROM DECORATIONS AND OTHER
 THINGS THAT CAN BURN.



- KEEP SPACE HEATERS AT LEAST 3 FEET FROM THINGS THAT CAN BURN.
 TURN SPACE HEATERS OFF WHEN YOU GO TO BED OR LEAVE THE ROOM.
 PLUG SPACE HEATERS DIRECTLY INTO WALL OUTLETS AND NEVER INTO AN EXTENSION CORD OR POWER STRIP.



- TEACH YOUR CHILDREN HOW TO ESCAPE ON THEIR OWN IN CASE YOU CANNOT HELP THEM.
- NOW AT LEAST 2 WAYS OUT OF EVERY ROOM, IF POSSIBLE.
 PICK A MEETING PLACE OUTSIDE WHERE EVERYONE WILL MEET IN AN EMERGENCY.
