On Tuesday evening the Water Management team was notified that we had a water main break at the intersection of Hwy 96W and Boyd Mill Avenue. Brad Furline worked to coordinate the repair with a team of four - Robbie Allen, Denver Hargrove, Cody Hartman, and Taylor Jolley. The repair was completed around 5:00 AM on Wednesday morning. While our Water Management team is experienced in this work, it is noteworthy that the time the repair took place was during the coldest part of this weather event with temperatures below zero. Their commitment and dedication to our customers is extraordinary. Many thanks to the team for their hard work in such harsh conditions.

We had another main break at the intersection of Jordan Road & Castlewood Drive with **Jared Christianson, Jaren Osborne, Robert Williams, Brandon Jones, Phillip Witt, Brendon Bennett, Robbie Allen, Denver Hargrove, Taylor Jolley, Mitch Colier, and Dennis Givens**. As that was being

repaired, we received a call that there was a main break in the Oakwood subdivision, and that crew broke off and headed over there to isolate. Once the Jordan Rd repair was fixed everyone headed over to Oakwood to finish the repair on that one.

Derek Harness, Shawn Edwards, and Sean Dooley, Michael Weems, Bryan Pyzer, Joe Shelby and Keith Poyner received tons of calls on frozen water and helped numerous residents regain water from issues on the customer's side.

A Water Treatment Plant heater in the membrane building went out and chemicals froze but **Gino** helped get heaters from Williamson County Emergency Management (WEMA).

The new solids building heater went out and **Gino** helped get heaters from WEMA also, several seal water pump lines were frozen and were limiting the pumping capacity of the plant. Service division crews headed out there to help repair lines, and **Taylor Hopkins**, **Juan Davis**, **Ivan Thurber**, **Jake Brady**, all helped to try and get the THP back online from freezing.

Great job by our WMD team for their excellent response in the most adverse conditions. Thank you!
