


As you heard in the Team Talks meetings the City will be conducting an employee survey. We want you to tell us how to make our organization a workplace you love! The survey will open January 30 – February 10. The survey is a benchmarked survey and we'll see how we compare to our peers. We hired a company called Energage and the survey is completely confidential. (see info attached.) We won't know who responded, but we can tell how many from a certain department has responded. Departments that reach 80 percent response rate will get a free lunch! The results will be released in the spring, and we WILL act on the feedback we get from employees! The survey is approximately 30 questions and most

 Factory District BOMA Discussion and Community Meeting scheduled. We are planning to have additional discussion at the 1/24 BOMA work session regarding the proposed creation of a Factory Arts District. This meeting will afford Alderman Brown and Alderman Baggett working with staff to further discuss the vision and goals for this proposal with the full Board.

In addition to the 1/24 work session, a community workshop has been scheduled for Thursday, February 16, 2023 at 5:30 PM to generate ideas and help create a new vision for the area around the Factory at Franklin. The



meeting will take place in the Heritage Room, located directly behind Liberty Hall, at the Factory at Franklin. The REA consultant team working on the Envision Franklin Update will facilitate this interactive meeting. This effort will involve a focus on placemaking and could include provisions for on-street parking along Liberty Pike, pedestrian streetscape enhancements, and encouragement of public art and creativity that would complement the area. It will also include considering additional land uses for the district, the boundaries of which would also need to be determined. The staff seeks to ensure an inclusive dialogue with the BOMA, FMPC, the Historic Zoning Commission, property owners, and citizens, prior to making any recommendations to amend our long-range planning and transportation guiding documents.

The **Streets Department** continues the City's first *Name That Snowplow* Contest. The snowplow naming has become a recent trend across the country. Below are the City's ground rules for submitting a name.
