**Update from the Leadership Team Meeting:** This week, we discussed upcoming work with the Board of Mayor and Aldermen to update the City's strategic plan, Franklin Forward. The updated plan will have a 10-year planning horizon along with specific priorities/goals for the next 1-3 year period. The Board will kick off the process on Monday, December 11<sup>th</sup>. We also reviewed some upcoming events including a leadership learning session with David Bator, managing director at Achievers Workforce Institute, who will share

insights and research related to employee engagement and belonging. This session will be held on December 14<sup>th</sup> and will include the Leadership Team, assistant directors, and other department leaders across the organization. The leadership team will also have a day-long retreat on December 15<sup>th</sup> at Columbia State. The Holiday Breakfast is set for December 20<sup>th</sup>. #### TODAY IS THE LAST DAY TO SIGN UP FOR THE

"Give a Day. Serve a Day. Get a Day." campaign for United Way!

This event is one of our best annual traditions here at the City of Franklin. It's a great way to give back to the community and an opportunity to earn an extra personal day for 2024.

**Last year we raised \$18,492.00!!** An increase of over **\$6,700 from 2021.** We'd love to continue this great trend and beat last year's record – but we can't do it without your help!

#### Here's how it works:

If you give a total contribution of at least \$100 to United Way (I'd challenge you to consider giving the equivalent of one day's pay) and commit to volunteering at least 8 hours over the next year with your chosen cause (i.e. – non-profit, church, school, etc.), you can receive an EXTRA personal day in 2024. The additional personal day will be awarded on January 15, 2024, and must be used during the 2024 calendar year.

#### Here are the details:

- Fill out a 2024 United Way Pledge form:
  - Your 2024 pledge to United Way can take the form of a payroll deduction (spread over 26 paychecks in 2024) or as a one-time payroll contribution, whichever works best for you.
     The minimum pledge to qualify is \$100. Use the attached form or get a paper form from the HR Office.
- Then, fill out the City of Franklin Give a Day form:
  - We ask that you sign a 2023 volunteer pledge that includes your name, department, and the cause/organization(s) that you are committing to dedicate at least 8 hours of volunteer time (non-work hours) this coming year. The choice of where and how you volunteer is up to you. You may also want to work with other City team members to volunteer as a group. Fill out the attached form or pick up a paper from the HR office.
- Once you have filled out and turned in both your United Way pledge form and your COF volunteer pledge form you will be credited with an additional personal day on **January 15, 2024**. The personal day must be used during the 2024 calendar year.

**The "Give a Day. Serve a Day. Get a Day" campaign runs through TODAY.** Both forms will need to be returned to Human Resources. If you are submitting via e-mail, please send both forms to cara.rives@franklintn.gov \*\*NOTE: Every form that is submitted this year will be responded to via email to let you know it has been received. If you submit a form and do not get an email confirmation, please contact Cara Rives in HR.
