Congratulations to our City Court Team! The Tennessee Department of Safety recently released their 2nd quarter reporting statistics, and we are very proud to share that Franklin City Court achieved 100% compliance. Of specific importance was the achievement of timely reporting of all Commercial Driver's License (CDL) convictions, which has helped reduced the number of commercial vehicles involved in fatal crashes by 36% across the State. Chief Deputy Court Clerk Natalie Keene and Deputies Kayelee Young and Ana Lopez made it a priority to timely report CDL convictions because this is a requirement that can literally save lives. We are very proud of their leadership and hard work to achieve this goal!

Walmart invites communities to prioritize their health as they head back to school at **Walmart Wellness Day on Saturday, August 19 from 10 a.m. - 2 p.m. local time.** This community event provides free health screenings, free and low-cost immunizations, and the opportunity to talk with a local Walmart pharmacist at more than 4,600 stores nationwide.

Since 2014, Walmart pharmacies have hosted Walmart Wellness Days, providing more than 5 million health screenings and 225,000 immunizations to customers across the country. During the event, affordable immunizations like flu, HPV, tetanus, hepatitis and more will be available. Customers can also participate in free health screenings for blood pressure, and more. Insurance is not required to receive a COVID-19 vaccination, which is available at no cost, and other vaccines are covered under most major insurance plans.

The City will be hosting flu shot clinics again this year for all full-time employees and their dependents, and part-time employees. These will be free of charge and will be offered on-site in September and at the Health & Safety Fair on October 26th. We will also be offering biometric



screenings for employees at the Health & Safety Fair. The Health & Safety Fair will be held at Rolling Hills Community Church on Columbia Ave. More information to come!
