At this week's Board of Mayor and Alderman meeting (9/26/2023), **Franklin Mayor Dr. Ken Moore proclaimed October 8-14, 2023, Fire Prevention Week in Franklin**. He reinforced this

year's theme, by telling residents, "Cooking safety starts with YOU. Pay attention to fire prevention." Nearly half of all fires in Franklin and across the country are caused by unattended cooking. The Franklin Fire Department has several activities for children planned throughout the month of October to mark the occasion:

POSTER CONTEST GRADES K-12: Entries should illustrate the Fire Prevention Week theme. One winner in each grade level will be awarded a \$50 Visa gift card, courtesy of Atmos Energy, and advance to the state competition sponsored by the TN State Fire Marshal's Office. 
