

The Franklin Police Department's newest crimefighter has a nose for narcotics. Koby,

He is trained to detect and alert to the odor of marijuana, cocaine, methamphetamine, and heroin. Koby can search buildings, vehicles, parcels, and more. "From time to time, our officers encounter individuals who appear to be involved in drug sales or may be impaired in some way and are transporting illegal narcotics," said **Franklin Police Chief Deb Faulkner**. "We believe having this resource will be a tremendous asset to our law





The Franklin Fire Department is offering free CPR classes on the first Saturday of April, May, and June, from 9 AM to noon, in the Franklin City Hall Training Room. For the registration link, go to www.franklintn.gov/CPR. According to the American Heart Association, immediate CPR can double or triple a person's chance of surviving cardiac arrest outside of the hospital. Franklin Firefighters who are paramedics and American Heart Association CPR Instructors will teach the AHA's Family & Friends curriculum. These will be three-hour, non-certification classes for those who want to learn CPR only. They are

not for those who need a CPR card to satisfy a job requirement. A participation card will be awarded to attendees, which those who babysit may find helpful. Participants will learn adult, child, and infant CPR, how to use an automated external defibrillator (AED), and how to relieve choking. The classes are recommended for those who are 12 years of age and older.
