The City of Franklin's Police Department is now among the highest paying agencies in Middle Tennessee. During Tuesday evening's Board of Mayor and Aldermen (BOMA) meeting, elected leaders unanimously approved adjusting the paygrades for new and existing officers. The starting salary for a new officer without law enforcement experience is now \$60,000. Those who are already certified will make at least \$65,000 when they are hired by the Police Department. Additionally, all current sworn officers will see a 3% boost in their

We are also examining pay for the Fire Department compared to the market and will make recommendations to the Board (likely in May). The adjustments in Police pay and anticipated adjustments in Fire represent a shift in our compensation "target" within the market. We are moving our pay target up to the 90th percentile compared to the market and plan to incorporate this approach in a full compensation plan review that will take place in 2025 for the fiscal year 2025-26 (FY26) budget.


Austin Benton, Permit Technician, Building and Neighborhood Services
