The pedestrian bridge at **The Park at Harlinsdale Farm** is now officially open. Officials, including **Tennessee Department of Transportation Commissioner/Deputy Governor Butch Eley and Franklin Mayor Ken Moore** spoke and helped cut the ribbon at an event held Wednesday afternoon. The total cost of the project is \$4.4 million, with \$3.2 million funded through the Transportation Alternative Program Funds (TAP) with the assistance from the Tennessee Department of Transportation. The bridge is 220 feet long and 12 feet wide. The Project also includes concrete stamping of a portion of the path in tribute to the Franklin-Nashville Interurban railroad, ADA upgrades, pedestrian lighting, and bike racks. Special thanks to our **Engineering** and **Parks Departments** who saw this project through completion, also to **Alfred Benesch**, **Civil & Environmental Consultants**, **Inc.**, **Kiser Vogrin Design and Dement Construction Co**.
