The **Franklin Fire Department now ranks in the 90**th **percentile or better for pay** in our region! This week, the Board of Mayor and Aldermen unanimously approved a significant pay increase for firefighters. The base starting salary for certified firefighters is now \$60,000. Additionally, firefighters with a paramedic license will receive an annual stipend of \$11,500, and those with an Advanced EMT license will receive \$5,000. The Department is now hiring. 

At the Cornersville High School graduation, Firefighter Pickle, a nine-year FFD veteran and Advanced EMT, sprang into action and started CPR after a 74-year-old man collapsed from cardiac arrest.
