The next time a Franklin Police Officer encounters an adult or child who is choking, they'll be



prepared to step in. The Franklin Police Department has purchased multiple LifeVac kits. The vital tool is a patented, non-invasive suction rescue device that can save a life in the event of an air obstruction. Once distributed, all patrol lieutenants and sergeants will be equipped with a LifeVac kit. "I hope they never have to use them," said Franklin Police Chief Deb Faulkner. "Having said that, it is not uncommon for our officers to encounter a grownup or child

who is struggling to breathe because something is lodged in their airway. It's important to be prepared." According to the National Safety Council, choking is the fourth leading cause of unintentional injury death. Infants and older adults are most at risk. At least one child dies from choking on food every five days in the United States, and more than 12,000 children are taken to a

hospital emergency room each year for food-choking injuries.

During yesterday's CarFit event at Somerby, the **Franklin Police Department** and CarFit technicians fitted 25 seniors. Thanks to Officers Buffa and LeCates for setting this up and their participation in the fittings. Great job!

Reminder: The Franklin-based Law Enforcement Assistance Partnership (LEAP) program is hoping to hit a grand slam for its home team police department. For each ticket purchased through the LEAP website to tonight's Nashville Sounds game, June 21, \$5 will be donated to the organization. The money will then be used to benefit the men and women at the Franklin Police Department. LEAP provides funding to police officers and their families in times of need. "We can't thank the LEAP volunteers enough for all their support year in and year out" said Franklin Police Chief Deb Faulkner. "It's our hope that the community will rally around the nonprofit for this inaugural initiative."
