Franklin Firefighters rescued a woman from an apartment fire at the IMT Residential community Thursday morning. They were dispatched at 7:42 AM to the three-story, 24-unit building at 101 Gillespie Drive after a resident called 911. Firefighters opened an unlocked door to a second-floor unit, finding heavy smoke inside. They quickly searched the apartment and found one victim lying on the couch. Two firefighters, Lieutenant-Paramedic Aaron Sherwood and Firefighter Steve Holmes carried

her to safety before extinguishing the fire, which was contained to the kitchen. Franklin **Fire Marshal Andy King** said the woman sustained smoke inhalation injuries and was transported to Vanderbilt University Medical Center by Williamson Health EMS. He said the fire started on the stovetop, igniting common household items and cardboard. Although the apartment had automatic fire sprinklers, the flames did not reach a temperature high enough to activate them.
