A Historic Moment at Carter Hill Battlefield Park! This past Saturday (10/19), Carter Hill Battlefield Park hosted a very special "Re-Patching Ceremony" with the United States Army and the Tennessee Army National Guard. This rare event marked the retirement of the 230th Sustainment

**Brigade**, which was renamed and **re-patched as the 35th**. This is a very special and unique event that we were honored to host in Franklin. **Franklin Fire Lt. Seth Frost** who also serves as a Commander and Captain in the Tennessee Army National Guard was part of this important ceremony. City leaders were there to witness this historic moment, as



members of the U.S. Army and TN Army National Guard stood together on this hallowed battlefield for the first time since the Civil War.

The City of Franklin became a Bee City USA affiliate earlier this year with a resolution that was passed by the BOMA. Pollinators play an important role in our food supply and the City chooses to support and encourage pollinator habitat creation and enhancement. As part of Bee City, we agree to plant native habitats that will help sustain our pollinators and reduce the use of pesticides that can negatively impact them. So far, the City has already converted several plant beds in downtown to all native plants. This week, we are



removing grass and planting three pollinator beds at our Fire Station 1. <u>Atmos</u> <u>Energy</u> has graciously sponsored the bed, by supplying the equipment and labor, and helped City staff prepare the beds for planting.

Native plant beds might take longer than typical beds to establish, sometimes up to three years before you see the desired full growth with colorful blooms. The plants chosen for this plant bed, have a variety of bloom times and create visual interest throughout the year. Below is the plant list in case you or someone you know may be interested in doing this on a smaller scale and learn which natives work in this region:

## Seeds

Coreopsis lanceolata - Lance Leaved Coreopsis Rudbeckia hirta - Black-eyed Susan Aster novae-angliae - New England Aster Monarda citriodora - Lemon Mint Echinacea purpurea - Purple Coneflower Asclepias incarnata - Swamp Milkweed Schizachyrium scoparium - Little Bluestem

#### **Shrubs**

HR has announced that the **Vacation Buyback Program is open for employee requests**! Employees who have a minimum available balance of 160 vacation hours (216 for Fire shift personnel) AND 5 years of continuous full-time City service as of October 1 are eligible to buy back up to 1 week or 40 hours (54 for Fire shift) of vacation to receive pay for the time accrued instead of rolling over or using their balance. **Employees must remain above the minimum hours requirement on the payout date to receive the buyback.** Please see Article XVII, Section B in the HR Manual for full details of the program. Employees will be notified of approval/denial of their request based on the eligibility criteria. Approved employees will receive their payment from the vacation buyback program on the second paycheck in December. If you are eligible and would like to request vacation buyback, please email <a href="mainto:vacationbuyback@franklintn.gov">vacationbuyback@franklintn.gov</a> with how many hours you would like to request to buyback. You can review your balance in UKG on your timecard under Accruals or on your homepage under the My Time Off widget. Your department's timekeeper can also help review balances.
