### **Purpose**

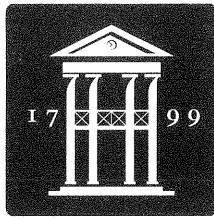
The purpose of this memorandum is to outline recommendations to the Board of Mayor and Aldermen (BOMA) for the Retail License Renewal received for an existing liquor store.

**RETAILER'S CERTIFICATE**

Pursuant to T.C.A. §57-3-208, the City of Franklin hereby certifies the following facts concerning applicant *Holiday Wine and Liquors* (Jigisha S. Patel), who has made application for a retailer's license to handle alcoholic beverages at 108 N. Royal Oaks Boulevard, which is within the corporate limits of the City of Franklin, Williamson County, Tennessee:

1. The owner who is to be in actual charge of the business has not been convicted of any violation of the laws against possession, sale, manufacture, or transportation of beer or other alcoholic beverages, or of any felony, or of any crime involving moral turpitude, within the past ten (10) years immediately preceding the date of application, and in the opinion of the undersigned, they will not violate any of the provisions of Tennessee Code Annotated, Title 57, Chapter 3;

2. The applicant(s) has secured a location for the business which complies with all restrictions of local law, ordinances, or resolutions, duly adopted by the local authorities as to location.

3. The applicant (by and through one or more of its owners) meets all residency requirements established by local authority under Franklin Municipal Code Section 2-108A.

4. The applicant has complied with local laws, ordinances, and resolutions duly adopted by the local authority regulating the number of retail licenses to be issued within the jurisdiction.
