# Purpose

The purpose of this memorandum is to outline recommendations to the Board of Mayor and Aldermen (BOMA) for the Retail License application received for a new owner of an existing liquor store.

## Background

At the Board's April 12<sup>th</sup> meeting, Mr. Vru Surati was granted approval for a new retail liquor license for an existing store located at 1110 Hillsboro Road. Mr. Surati has since brought it to our attention that he is the managing agent for the store, and part of an LLC. Therefore, in accordance with Municipal Code Section 8-109, the certificate needs to be reissued in the name of Jai Guru Dev of Franklin, LLC, with Mr. Surati named as the Managing Agent.

#### **Financial Impact**

There is no direct financial impact on the City associated with this action.

#### Recommendation

Approval of the revised retail liquor license for 1110 Hillsboro Road is recommended.

## RETAILER'S CERTIFICATE

Pursuant to T.C.A. §57-3-208, the City of Franklin hereby certifies the following facts concerning application in the name of Jai Guru Dev of Franklin, LLC, held jointly with the managing agent, Vrushank Surati, who has made application for a retailer's license to handle alcoholic beverages at 110A Hillsboro (The Corner Wine and Spirits), which is within the corporate limits of the City of Franklin, Williamson County, Tennessee:

- 1. The owner(s) who are to be in actual charge of the business have not been convicted of any violation of the laws against possession, sale, manufacture, or transportation of beer or other alcoholic beverages, or of any felony, or of any crime involving moral turpitude, within the past ten (10) years immediately preceding the date of application, and in the opinion of the undersigned, they will not violate any of the provisions of Tennessee Code Annotated, Title 57, Chapter 3;
- 2. The applicant(s) has secured a location for the business which complies with all restrictions of local law, ordinances, or resolutions, duly adopted by the local authorities as to location.
- 3. The applicant (by and through one or more of its owners) meets all residency requirements established by local authority under Franklin Municipal Code Section 2-108A.
- 4. The applicant has complied with local laws, ordinances, and resolutions duly adopted by the local authority regulating the number of retail licenses to be issued within the jurisdiction.
