

RESOLUTION NO. 2011-30

A RESOLUTION TO APPLY FOR PHASE II HAZARD MITIGATION GRANT PROGRAM (HMGP) FUNDS AVAILABLE DUE TO THE MAY 2010 PRESIDENTIAL DISASTER DECLARATION (FEMA-1909-DR-TN)

WHEREAS, the City of Franklin was included in the May 2010 Presidential Disaster Declaration due to flooding in Middle Tennessee (**FEMA-1909-DR-TN**); and

WHEREAS, the Tennessee Emergency Management Agency has notified the City of Franklin that over \$25,000,000 is available for Phase II projects from unused allocations from Phase I of the Hazard Mitigation Grant Program (HMGP); and

WHEREAS, Phase II of the HMGP allows applications for acquisition of repetitively flooded properties, and

WHEREAS, the City of Franklin has identified four homes located in the floodplain that had been repetitively flooded by previous flooding events and that were substantially damaged (50% or greater) during the flood in May, 2010; and

WHEREAS, the owners of these homes have requested that the City consider purchasing their properties; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Mayor and Aldermen supports the reduction of potential hazards throughout the City due to flooding and endeavors to protect the life and property of its citizens through any measures available.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Mayor and Aldermen of the City of Franklin, Tennessee that the City, through its Building and Neighborhood Services Department, will apply to the Tennessee Emergency Management Agency for funds available in Phase II of the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) Hazard Mitigation Grant Program (HMGP) due to the May 2010 Presidential Disaster Declaration (FEMA-1909-DR-TN).

SUBJECT: Phase 2 Application for Hazard Mitigation Grant Program; May 2010 Flood Event;
Presidential Declaration FEMA-1909-DR-TN

PURPOSE

The purpose of this action is to obtain authorization from the Board of Mayor and Aldermen (BOMA) to proceed with application to the Tennessee Emergency Management Agency (TEMA) for funds available in Phase 2 of the Hazard Mitigation Grant Program (HMGP) due to the May 2010 Flood, Presidential Declaration (FEMA-1909-DR-TN).

BACKGROUND

The City of Franklin made application in March of 2011 to participate in Phase 1 of the Hazard Mitigation Grant Program which allocated \$1,133,097 toward reducing or eliminating damages to structures in the event of a future flood. The City of Franklin share is shown below:

Federal share (75%)	\$849,823
State share (12.5%)	\$141,637
COF share (12.5%)	\$141,637

According to the requirements of the Phase 1 grant program, the funds will be used to purchase properties that were significantly damaged by 50% or more from the May 2010 flood. Once purchased, the properties would belong to the City of Franklin in perpetuity and be designated as open space lots. In Phase 1, five (5) properties were identified that would benefit the City of Franklin and also lessen the impact to the surrounding areas to a future flood. The property owners have all agreed to participate and understand that this is a voluntary program and that they may back out at any time up to the point of closing on the purchase of their property.

Over \$25 million went unclaimed for mitigation in the initial Phase 1 program. Phase 2 now allows the City of Franklin to make application for additional funds with the same percentage share being allocated (75%/12.5%/12.5%). The difference in the Phase 2 grant is that no limit was set on the available funds by jurisdiction as were designated in Phase 1. The determination will be made according to the number of applications submitted by those government entities that qualified during the Presidential Declaration.

Staff used the same criteria in determining the properties for consideration. Of the properties that originally requested to participate in the program, there are four that sustained damage that was estimated at or above 50%. We anticipate the 12.5% share this time to be below \$100,000. Of course, this amount could go higher if the Board of Mayor and Aldermen identified more than these four

properties. The exact figure will be determined through appraisals that are required if the City of Franklin is awarded a grant.

Discussion

The deadline is June 30, 2011. A quick determination must be made by the Board on the June 28, 2011, regular meeting of BOMA to meet this deadline. Staff will process the final application and submit to the State of Tennessee, who will then process it further to the Federal government.

Financial Impact

The City must purchase the properties and then be reimbursed by FEMA. Our cost can also include appraisals, demolition, and other miscellaneous expenses. We expect the cost to be less than \$100,000, unless more properties are added or we include properties with a higher value. It is also the prerogative of the Board to identify less than four properties and lessen the cost to the City.

Recommendation

Staff recommends that the Board of Mayor and Aldermen adopt a Resolution to submit the application to TEMA for the Phase 2 Grant to include the remaining properties submitted by property owners that sustained damage of 50% or greater.

**General Information for the State of Tennessee's Phase II Implementation of the
Hazard Mitigation Grant Program**

Program Goal: Permanently eliminate or significantly reduce the repetitive damages caused by natural events and disasters.

Application Deadline: June 30, 2011

Eligible Applicants:

- Communities included in the May 2010 Presidential Declaration;
- Communities in good standing with the National Flood Insurance Program (NFIP); and
- Communities holding a current FEMA approved hazard mitigation plan.

Funding: 75% Federal share, 12.5% State share, and 12.5% Local share (local share can be comprised of cash and/or in-kind services).

Types of Projects: Types of projects are those that mitigate the type of disaster incurred (i.e. flooding, tornado), and can include:

- Acquisition of repetitively flooded properties;
- Flood control (drainage improvement, retention/detention basin, etc.);
- Safe areas (reinforced corridors in schools, shelter areas, etc.); and
- Mitigation planning
