### 6. Approval of Minutes

Alderman Skinner moved to approve the following minutes, May 24, 2011 Work Session, May 24, 2011 Executive Session, and May 24, 2011 BOMA meeting. Seconded by Alderman Barnhill. Motion carried unanimously.

#### 7. Recognitions

<u>Heritage Foundation Preservation Award</u>

The City of Franklin was awarded the Heritage Foundation's Preservation Award for "New Institutional Construction" for the Columbia Avenue Streetscape Project. The awards were presented last night at the newly renovated Franklin Cinema.

#### • The Tennessee City Management Association (TCMA)

The Brentwood and Franklin Fire Departments jointly received the "Award for Excellence in Municipal Government" at the annual TCMA conference in Murfreesboro. The award was given for the exemplary cooperation and innovation through an Automatic Aid Agreement that resulted in added resources and greater security for the residents of both communities.

In the 22 months since the agreement was authorized, Brentwood responded into Franklin on automatic aid calls 19 times. Franklin responded into Brentwood on automatic aid calls 10 times. Traditional mutual aid response: Franklin into Brentwood 12 times, and Brentwood into Franklin 5 times.

#### • <u>Proclamation - Dump the Pump Day</u>

June 16, 2011 proclaimed as Dump the Pump Day in Franklin, Tennessee. This is a day that encourages people to ride public transportation to save money, protect the environment, reduce dependence on foreign oil, and improve the quality of life for all Americans. Franklin residents urged to join with the Franklin Transit Authority and transit agencies across the country in participating in this special day to encourage transit ridership. Alderman Petersen moved to approve Ordinance 2011-17 with an amendment to reduce Stormwater expenditures, a \$1,295,000 reduction, and a payroll increase of \$59,838. Seconded by Alderman Bransford. Motion carried unanimously on Second of Three Readings.

Alderman Petersen moved to approve Ordinance 2011-18 with an amendment to the General Fund 21.08 cents (\$0.2108) or percentage approximate to 56% based on certified tax rate, and to Debt Service Fund 16.57 cents (\$0.1657) or percentage approximate to 44% based on certified tax rate for a total of 37.65 cents (\$.3765) Property Tax Rate. Seconded by Alderman Barnhill. Motion carried unanimously on Second of Three Readings.
