SUBJECT: Award Recommendation for Contract 2011-0133,

Traffic Signal and Foundation Replacement at Del Rio Pike & Magnolia Avenue

Purpose

The purpose of this memo is to provide information to the Board of Mayor and Aldermen (BOMA) for the consideration of the quotation responses to the subject request for quotations. The responses were opened on September 26, 2011.

Background

The traffic signal at Del Rio & Magnolia was installed in 2008 as part of the widening of Del Rio Pike. The intersection has two signal supports each with moderately long two-way mast arms and a luminaire arm. City Engineering initiated a program to monitor the signal head clearances in March 2010 in response to Street Department observation of adverse leaning of these signal supports. There were several months after the initial monitoring where no observations were recorded, until this spring when a citizen stated to me that the leaning on one of the supports seemed to be more adverse. Measurements resumed and verified that clearances were decreasing at a quickened pace, which needed immediate attention. On Thursday morning April 21, 2011 William Fox, Rodney Escobar and I met at the site, Rodney verified insurance coverage of the re-installation effort subject to a \$25,000 deductible, then William Fox arranged for S & W Contracting Company to install a temporary anchor that was placed that afternoon. (Arrangements were made with the Magnolia Commons property manager for right of entry and placement of the anchor on its open space lot.) During the day on Monday April 25, 2011 William Fox and crew installed the two temporary trailer signal mast arms and S & W completely removed the sagging signal support from its foundation. Wiser Company, an engineering consultant for S & W Contracting Company, submitted to the City a proposal for re-design of the foundation including a geotechnical investigation, and Contract COF 2011-0078 for these services was finalized on July 1, 2011. The final plans and cost estimate (\$16,830.00) arrived on September 7, 2011 and the request for quotations went out on September 12, 2011. (Joe York had obtained direction from Vernon Gerth that requests for at least three construction quotes needed to be sought for this project.) Therefore the subject recommendation has been prepared for immediate consideration, given the need to minimize the deployment time for the temporary trailer signal supports. This item is for consideration at the first October BOMA Regular Meeting.

Financial Impact

Two of the three contractors receiving invitations to submit quotes provided responses. Both of these were within the Engineer's Opinion of Probable Costs of \$16,830 for the construction of this project. The lowest qualifying quote of \$9,409.00 by S & W Contracting Company should be accepted for payment from the Street Department Traffic Signal Maintenance account. The other quote of \$12,865.00 by Stansell Electric Company is inferior to that of S & W Contracting Company.



MEMORANDUM

Recommendation

As the quote of S & W Contracting Company came in under \$10,000, City Administrator Eric Stuckey should on behalf of BOMA approve and award Contract COF 2011-0133 to S & W. If this recommendation is approved, the project should be completed within 30 calendar days of the issuance of the Notice to Proceed.
