Alderman Martin moved to approve the Consent Agenda, Items 23-33 with the exception of the withdrawal of Item 26. Seconded by Alderman Bransford. Motion carried unanimously.

#### OLD BUSINESS

# 10.Consideration of ORDINANCE 2009-55 As Amended, An Ordinance to Amend The City of Franklin<br/>Municipal Code, Title 11, Chapter 4, Offenses Against the Peace and Quiet<br/>[Second and Final Reading]Shauna Billingsley, City Attorney

Alderman Skinner moved to approve Ordinance 2009-55 as Amended on August 9, 2011 on Second and Final Reading. Seconded by Alderman Bransford.

Alderman Skinner moved to amend the Ordinance, page 2, Section 11-403, Unnecessary Noise Standard, # (2) Commercial and Industrial Zoning Districts, No person shall cause, suffer, allow or permit sound amplified sound which originates indoors which is plainly audible when measured......, and under the same section, create # (5) to read: Amplification of sound that originates from outdoors located in or within one hundred (100) feet of a residential property line which is plainly audible is prohibited between the hours of 9:00 p.m. and 7:00 a.m. Sunday through Thursday and between the hours of 10:00 p.m. and 7:00 a.m. Friday and Saturday except for special events where a special permit has been obtained from the City of Franklin authorizing such event. Seconded by Alderman Martin.

Discussion:

- Alderman McLendon thought it unwise to spend millions to promote tourism and economic growth downtown and then put a damper on the businesses because of a handful of complaints. The majority of the complaints have not been because of outdoor venues, rather from people living near these venues.
- Alderman Martin countered that the residents were there first and there was never a problem until the music was allowed outside.
- Alderman Bransford supported the original motion. Staff met with citizens and business and this Ordinance is the compromise.
- Alderman Barnhill noted the ordinance has been discussed numerous times. He was not in favor of a last minute change without the benefit of input from businesses and residents.
- Alderman Petersen commented the Ordinance has been presented as something to try. Further, it is not just music from outside venues.

• Alderman Burger was unwilling to make a change at this point. She asked that the Ordinance be revisited in one year.

Motion to Amend as stated above FAILED 2-5 with Aldermen Martin and Skinner voting yea and Aldermen McLendon, Burger, Barnhill, Bransford, and Petersen voting nay.

Main Motion to approve Ordinance 2009-55 as Amended August 9, 2011 carried 6-1 with Alderman Martin voting no.

11. <u>PUBLIC HEARING</u>: Consideration of ORDINANCE 2011-28, An Ordinance to Amend Chapter 3, Section 3.2.2 and Section 3.2.3, Table 3-2: Permitted Uses, in the Franklin Zoning Ordinance to Permit Detached Dwelling Units in The Neighborhood Mixed-Use (MN) Zoning District [Second of Three Readings] Alderman Ann Petersen, FMPC Representative

With no one coming forward to speak, Mayor Moore declared the Public Hearing closed

Alderman Bransford moved to approve Ordinance 2011-28 on Second of Three Readings. Seconded by Alderman Barnhill. Motion carried unanimously.

12. <u>PUBLIC HEARING</u>: Consideration of ORDINANCE 2011-29, An Ordinance to Amend Title 22, Chapter 18, to Establish New Water Rates and Sanitary Sewer User Rates [Second of Three Readings] Mark Hilty, Water Management Director

Public Hearing:

• Jay Wade, Jefferson Drive, Franklin, spoke against the rates being raised. He quoted from past staff memos and meeting minutes to make his point and implore the Board to not approve any more major expansions.

With no one else coming forward to speak, Mayor Moore declared the Public Hearing closed

Alderman Skinner moved to approve Ordinance 2011-29 on Second of Three Readings. Seconded by Alderman McLendon.

- Alderman Petersen mentioned the added revenue would provide money to do repairs and replacement; however, she still has reservations and said the Board should look at this annually to see where it stands.
- Alderman McLendon said the City is obligated to keep the enterprise funds as close to zero as possible.
- Russ Truell noted the City could not increase these rates if there were excessive reserves

Motion to approve Ordinance 2011-29 on Second of Three Readings carried unanimously.

Alderman Petersen moved defer to Work Session and Board meeting September 13, 2011 due to lack of complete information. Seconded by Alderman Skinner.

Alderman Petersen's reasons for deferral were that the Board did not receive the information in time to review fully, there is a change in the method of funding, and this capital project was not one of the top CIP priorities.

Alderman Skinner supported deferral until completion of negotiation of legal easement. Eric Stuckey responded that the Board has given staff parameters to work within.

Motion to defer FAILED 2-5 with Aldermen Petersen and Skinner voting yea, and Aldermen Martin, McLendon, Burger, Barnhill, and Bransford voting nay.

Motion to approve Resolution 2011-43 carried unanimously.
