SUBJECT: Consideration of Change Order No. 2 for the Nichol Mill Lane Improvements Project

(COF Contract No. 2010-0180) for a Contract Time Extension of 120 Calendar Days.

Purpose

The purpose of this memorandum is to provide information to the Board of Mayor and Aldermen (BOMA) for the consideration of Change Order No 2 to the Nichol Mill Lane Improvements Project for Phase II construction.

Background

On July 13, 2010 the Board of Mayor and Aldermen passed unanimously Resolution 2010-51, a Resolution to authorize the construction of the Nichol Mill Lane Project. Construction Bids were publicly opened and read aloud on January 6, 2011 and Jenco Construction, Inc was the low bidder. The Construction Notice to Proceed date was February 14, 2011 with a contract completion date of October 12, 2011. Change Order No 1 was approved on August 23, 2011 adding 63 days and changing the contract completion date to December 14, 2011. The contractor was scheduled to complete the entirety of the project but encountered delays due to numerous complications including utility relocations and the inability to complete final pavement during the approaching winter months. Paving requirements will continue to delay the project throughout the winter months until pavement plants reopen next spring. Construction is not expected to be completed by the current contract expiration date. Therefore the contractor has requested additional time to complete the project.

City Staff is recommending adding 120 additional calendar days to the contract to allow for adequate time to complete Phase II of the project. This would move the Phase II completion date to April 12, 2012.

Dear Micky:

Jenco Construction has provided us with the attached letter indicating project delays which have impeded construction progress on Phase II. We have reviewed the timeline of events described within the letter and believe that a time extension is warranted.

We recommend that <u>120 calendar days</u> be recorded as an approved time extension to the contract. The contractor request is for 90 days; however we have included an additional 30 days based upon the typical calendar for spring time paving operations which will be required on the project. This would move the Phase II completion date to April 12, 2012. A Change Order form is attached to this letter for your use. No additional utility delays are anticipated. Any weather delays will be considered on a monthly basis with the contractor's payment request.

We appreciate the opportunity to work with the City on this project. Do not hesitate to contact me to discuss this further.

RE: Time Extension Request

Dear Sirs,

Jenco Construction Inc. respectfully is requesting a time extension on the above mentioned project, due to circumstances beyond our control.

In early July, we discussed and met with AT & T about the conflicts of their fiber optic line in phase II of the project. Numerous phone calls and e-mails after the meeting were made with no progress being made. AT & T's representative allowed 2 to 3 weeks for relocation, which would have worked for our completion date of 12/14/11.

Relocation of the fiber optic line was 11/4/11. Jenco started back to work on phase II on 11/7/11. Jenco Construction Inc. has been able to work a total of 8 days since September 1, 2011. Subcontractors have been able to spot work. This is not how we bid this project to be completed.

With this being said, we have lost 2 months of good working weather due to utility relocations on phase II, and another month in November due to weather.

We are asking for 90 additional days added to the 12/14/11 deadline, which would put the new completion date on or around April 4, 2012. Paving usually does not start back up until mid April or early May depending on weather and employees returning from winter layoffs.

Jenco Construction, Inc. does not wave our rights for additional days due to inclimative weather of the winter months which were not anticipated when bidding this project. If I can be of further assistance, please feel free to call.
