SUBJECT:	Outstanding Debt – Municipal Court

PURPOSE

The purpose of this memorandum is to provide additional information requested by the Budget and Finance Committee of efforts to collect outstanding debts owed the City.

BACKGROUND

This follows the November 2011 discussion of efforts to collect bad debts, particularly for outstanding court obligations.

FINDINGS

We have an extensive follow-up process to pursue outstanding court obligations but additional tools are needed. Both the Tennessee Code and the Franklin Municipal Code have specific considerations when pursuing using a Collections Agent. Additional information was provided to the Committee on January 4, 2012 and is included in the enclosed materials.

FINANCIAL IMPACT

Uncollected obligations affect all citizens and customers. There was about \$550,000 in outstanding obligations owed the Court last fiscal year that can be pursued using a Collections Agent. As noted in the material provided, we have a ten (10) year statute of limitations.

ALTERNATIVES

The alternatives considered include:

- 1. Continue the same course and not pursue outstanding court fees through a collection agent.
- 2. Pursue legal actions using our Legal Department.
- 3. Pursue using a competitively bid contract to pursue outstanding obligations.

RECOMMENDATION

It is recommended that the Budget and Finance Committee accept this status report and that guidance be provided to pursue the issuance of a request for proposals for a collections agent (option 3).
